

Explanation of Titles

The International Jedi Federation uses titles and paths to clarify stages of learning, service, and responsibility within the organization. These titles are not measures of spiritual worth or personal enlightenment, but reflect the level of commitment and accountability an individual has chosen to hold in relation to the IJF and the wider Jedi community. Advancement is optional, and each path exists to serve different callings, capacities, and forms of contribution within the Jedi community. Titles describe stages of formation and ongoing service, while disciplines reflect how one chooses to serve based on calling, gifts, and community need.

Member

Definition

A member is someone who has registered on the website and agrees to abide by the code of conduct, the constitution, and bylaws of the International Jedi Federation as described in the Policy Documents.

Member Requirements:

- Fill out application for membership on the website

Seeker

Definition

A Seeker is a member who has completed the first semester of the Jedi Seeker Path curriculum, either in the form of live Zoom classes or the Solo Seeker path via recorded videos or text based option.

Seeker Requirements to Candidacy:

- Must have completed the first semester of the Jedi Seeker Path curriculum as well homework assignments
- All assignments must be reviewed by a member of the Education Department before proceeding to second Semester

Apprentice

Definition

An Apprentice is a member who has graduated from the Jedi Seeker Path and sought a one-on-one apprenticeship with a mentor (Jedi Knight or Jedi Master).

Apprentice Requirements to Candidacy:

- Must have completed the first and second semester of the Jedi Seeker Path curriculum
 - Must apply for an Apprenticeship via application

Adept (Optional)

Definition

An Adept has completed their apprenticeship by demonstrating their ability to embody the principles of the Jedi Compass, and seek to advance themselves in the Jedi Arts for a specific life mission dedicated to their personal offline community. Adepts are not afforded an opportunity to take on apprentices, become Chapter Leaders, or enroll in disciplines (Sage Path, Mystic Path, etc)

Adept Requirements to Candidacy:

- Must have completed the Jedi Seeker Path
- Completed an apprenticeship
- Two letters of recommendation (one must be their Mentor)
- Must have passed all Adept Trials

Adept Trials:

- Undergo a Labyrinth of Trials
- Pass a Practical Exam
- Go through a Ceremony of Dedication to the Jedi Path

Adept Privileges:

- May serve on any committee
- May teach a class or workshop overseen by a Knight or Master

Knight

Definition

A Knight is one who has completed their apprenticeship by living the virtues and ethics of the Jedi Compass. Through discipline, reflection, and service, they have proven themselves ready to walk the path of greater responsibility. Jedi Knights stand as exemplars of the Jedi way, representing the highest ideals of the Jedi community and the International Jedi Federation. Committed to continual growth in the Jedi Arts, Jedi Knights dedicate themselves to serving their local communities, the IJF, and the wider Jedi community. Their path of service may take many forms: guiding others as Jedi Mentors and Educators, leading as Chapter Leaders or IJF Council Members, fostering connection through thoughtful facilitation in approved Jedi spaces and events, and building or stewarding IJF departments that strengthen the mission and vision of the Order. Above all, a Jedi Knight serves not for recognition, but to uplift others, to embody the Jedi way in action, and to help light the path for those who follow.

Knight Requirements to Candidacy:

- Must have completed the Jedi Seeker Path
- Completed an apprenticeship
- Two letters of recommendation (one must be their Mentor)
- Must have passed all Knight Trials

**Exceptions exists for Knighthood Transfer Assessments

Knight Trials:

- Undergo a Labyrinth of Trials
- Pass a Practical Exam
- Undergo a Background Check
- Sit before a Knighting Panel

Knight Privileges:

- May join any Discipline (Sage Path, Mystic Path, etc)
- May serve on any committee
- May run a Jedi Chapter

- May have apprenticeships
 - May become an Educator for any Discipline they have achieved
 - May serve on the Jedi Council

Master

Definition

A Master has demonstrated the deepest devotion to the Jedi way, embodying the ethics and virtues of the Jedi Compass in every facet of their lives. Through years of discipline, service, and reflection, they are distinguished by exceptional character, profound knowledge, and hard-won wisdom. A Master has demonstrated unparalleled skill in one or more aspects of the Jedi Arts, tempered by humility and clarity of purpose. Masters commit themselves to continual growth both within themselves and within the communities they serve, online and offline. As anchors of stability and insight, they guide not through authority alone, but through presence, example, and compassionate leadership, ensuring that the Jedi Path continues to flourish for generations to come.

Master Requirements to Candidacy:

- Must be a Jedi Knight in good standing, with a minimum of 7 years consistently as a Jedi Knight
- Must submit a body of work in accordance with the specifications of the department (Sage Path, Mystic Path, etc) overseeing their discipline to the Director of the Department
- Unanimous approval for candidacy from the Knights of the Order

Master Trials:

- Must have passed the Master Labyrinth

Post-Knight Disciplines (Optional)

After earning Knighthood, a Jedi may choose to deepen their service through one or more specialized disciplines or paths aligned with their gifts, interests, and calling within the Jedi Arts and the wider community. These disciplines are optional, do not replace Knighthood, and are not required for advancement. They reflect how a Knight chooses to serve rather than seniority, rank, or authority. Each discipline maintains its own

training standards and areas of focus, overseen by the appropriate department within the International Jedi Federation. A Jedi Knight may pursue multiple disciplines over time or none at all, based on personal calling and community need.

Post-Knight Disciplines include, but are not limited to:

Sage Path

Definition

A Jedi Sage is a Jedi Knight who seeks synergy across the physical, mental, and spiritual dimensions of life through disciplined study, reflection, and practice. The Sage Path emphasizes balance, clarity, and presence, alongside the cultivation of wisdom applied in service to peace and understanding.

Purpose of the Sage Path

The purpose of the Sage Path is to support Jedi Knights in deepening their personal integration and developing the skills necessary to navigate complexity, conflict, and ethical challenge with discernment and clarity. Through this path, Knights explore both exoteric and esoteric approaches to kinesiology, diplomacy, negotiation, and de-escalation, as well as philosophical, metaphysical, and theological understandings of the Force. The Sage Path prepares Jedi Knights to serve as thoughtful guides, facilitators, and stabilizing presences within their communities, applying knowledge with humility, responsibility, and care.

Mystic Path

Definition

A Jedi Mystic is a Jedi Knight who dedicates themselves to the exploration of inner awareness, spiritual practice, and sacred reflection. The Mystic Path emphasizes contemplative depth, symbolic understanding, and connection to the transcendent aspects of the Jedi experience.

Purpose of the Mystic Path

The purpose of the Mystic Path is to support Jedi Knights in cultivating spiritual insight and embodied presence through meditation, ritual, chaplaincy, and reflective practice. This path encourages exploration of how diverse religious and spiritual traditions can

inform and enrich the Jedi journey. Through this work, Mystics develop the capacity to facilitate contemplative spaces and offer grounded, compassionate peer support, helping individuals and communities connect more deeply with meaning, purpose, and inner stillness.

Healer Path (In Development)

The Healer Path is currently in a collaborative development phase. Jedi Knights are invited to participate in shaping its scope and direction. Jedi Knights who hold professional or licensed backgrounds in healing-related fields are especially encouraged to contribute to the development of this path.

Definition

A Jedi Healer is a Jedi Knight who seeks to express Jedi principles through care and support that promote balance and well-being within individuals and communities. This path centers personal responsibility and compassionate care in service to individuals and communities.

Purpose of the Healer Path

The Healer Path supports Jedi Knights in three interconnected areas: engaging in their own healing work and discovering their healing gifts; gaining exposure to a range of healing modalities to develop discernment and an understanding of multimodal approaches; and identifying appropriate external education, certification, or licensure in methods that call to them. Through this process, IJF seeks to cultivate a trusted network of properly trained and credentialed Knights who can ethically support their communities and offer informed referrals.
